

RECRUIT TO MARINE CADET ADVANCEMENT TRAINING

RECRUIT TRAINING PHASE ONE

- 1301 Phase One is probably the most important training phase of all. A really good job done in this phase is bound to be reflected in all the later phases of training and in a cadet's performance in all his advancement examinations.
- 1302 Marine Cadet Detachments must endeavour to cover Part I Marine Cadet training from Marine Cadet Recruit to Marine Cadet 2nd Class. Advancement regulations from Marine Cadet to Cadet Sergeant are contained in Chapters 14 to 17.
- 1303 A Recruit may be advanced to Marine Cadet by the Unit Commanding Officer provided the following requirements are met:
- A minimum of six weeks as a Recruit
 - Satisfactory completion of Part One of Phase One training.
 - Passing the qualifying exam for Marine Cadet
 - Recommendation by the OCMCD.

PHASE ONE TRAINING SYLLABUS

- 1304 The Phase One training syllabus for advancement from Recruit up to Marine Cadet standard is:

- R1 TOUR OF UNIT HEADQUARTERS *Unit Standing Orders.
Lesson Plans.*
- Explain Unit Fire Orders and identify Fire Exits
 - Visit all sections and explain their functions e.g. Admin/Ship's Office, Quarterdeck, QM's lobby etc.
 - Introduce Naval terms e.g. Libertymen, coming on board, going ashore etc.
 - The New Entry is to draw a sketch of the Unit Building and record Fire Exits and positions of Unit Fire Equipment.
- R2 UNIT ORGANISATION *Unit Standing Orders.

- Explain the Chain of Command
 - Introduction to Officers, Senior Rates, Civilian Instructors and teach how to address them.
 - Outline the Divisional and Watch system as it applies to the Unit.
 - Teach the recognition of the **Still**, the **Carry On** and the **General Call**.

- Explain the history and importance of the Colours and Evening Colours Ceremonies.
 - Witness the Colours and Evening Colours Ceremonies.
 - Explain the parts of the mast, the use of the Preparative Pennant and the history and use of the Church Pennant.
 - Explain the routine duties of the following:
 - Signalmen: Give brief explanation of SCC Ensign and the Preparative Pennant.

- v. Personal cleanliness and appearance in uniform at all times.
- vi. Regular attendance.
- b. The Marine Cadet Promise

R15 HEALTH AND SAFETY

Unit Standing Orders

Explain:

- a. The underlying principles of Health and Safety
- b. Hazards within the Unit
- c. Hazards associated with Unit training
- d. The importance of reporting hazards

1305 Phase One Training for Recruit to MC should be completed in six weeks wherever possible.

1306 All Cadets should pass the Marine Cadet basic swimming tests as soon as possible.

QUALIFYING EXAMINATION

1307 The qualifying examination is set by SCHQ. Examinations are convened at Unit level by OCMCD. They are documented on form SCC T8a.
