Teach the dangers of restrictive clothing.</li><li>c. Teach the reasons why other must be notified of your plans.</li></ul> <p>Awareness of dangers and safety considerations when swimming :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>d. Teach the dangers of wearing jewellery, goggles and skylarking at a poolside.</li><li>e. Teach the dangers of tides and currents, to observe warning notices, hidden debris below the water.</li></ul> <p>Cadet must be made aware of the hidden dangers in the home :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>f. Teach the dangers of hot hobs and grills, kettle, saucepans and charcoal fires.</li><li>g. The reasons for and importance of Risk</li></ul> <p>Assessment within the Unit and for Unit activities, and the outcome of proper Risk Assessments.</p>
